HONORARY DEGREES AND HONORARY FELLOWSHIPS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF LONDON

1. Honorary Awards conferred by the University of London

1.1 Honorary Degrees: The Board of Trustees may approve the conferral of an honorary degree of the University on a person of conspicuous merit, who is outstanding in their feld, commands internat onal, or at least nat onal recognit on, or who has given except onal service to the University.

1.2 The honorary degrees that may be awarded are as follows:

- < Doctor of Divinity (DD)
- < Doctor of Laws (LLD)
- < Doctor of Literature (DLit)
- < Doctor of Literature (Educat on) (DLit(Ed))
- < Doctor of Music (DMus)
- < Doctor of Science (DSc)
- < Doctor of Science (Economics) (DSc(Econ))
- < Doctor of Science (Engineering) (DSc(Eng))</pre>
- < Doctor of Science (Medicine) (DSc(Med))
- < Doctor of Science (Social Sciences) (DSc(SocSc))</pre>
- < Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVetMed)
- < Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd)

1.3 Honorary Fellowships:



- front bench members of the House of Lords;
- other leading act ve members of a polit cal party; and
- < persons in similar posit ons in other countries.

2.4 An honorary degree or honorary fellowship will not normally be conferred on a person who:

- has already been awarded an honorary degree, or honorary fellowship of the University of London, either by the University or by a Federat on Member; or
- A has previously declined to accept a University of London award from the University or from a Federat on Member.

2.5 An honorary degree or honorary fellowship will not, normally, be conferred

2.6 Where the Board of Trustees has formally resolved to confer an honorary degree or the Board of Trustees has resolved to award an honorary fellowship on a person, and the death of that person

- 5.3 Each Federat on Member will determine its procedures for inviting and approving nominations and conferring honorary degrees, subject to observing the following:
- 5.4 The criteria detailed in paragraphs 1.1 to 2.4 this Ordinance will apply, as will any further criteria or requirements approved by the Board of Trustees and communicated to Federat on Members.
- 5.5 An honorary degree will not be conferred on a person whose contribut on or achievements lie chief y in service to the Federat on Member, and will not normally be conferred on someone who is already a fellow or honorary fellow of the Federat on Member.
- 5.6 A proposal to confer an honorary degree should be made by a Federat on Member commit ee which will be chaired by either the Head of the Federat on Member or the Chair of the governing body and whose members will include both lay members of the governing body and members of the academic staf. The proposal will be considered and approved by the Federat on Member Governing Body.
- 5.7 In of ering a person an honorary degree, the Federat on Member will make it clear that it is an honorary degree of the University conferred by the Federat on Member.
- 5.8 At any ceremony to confer the honorary degree, unless the Chancellor is able to be present, the Head of the Federat on Member, or his or her nominated representat ve, will confer the degree on behalf of the Chancellor and the University (unless the Federat on Member requests that it be done by the Vice-Chancellor), although the Head of the Federat on Member need not pres

- the arms of the University; the arms or logo of the Federat on Member may also be added;
- the name "University of London" and the name of the Federat on Member; the name of the University being the same size as that of the Federat on Member;
- the name of the recipient and the degree;
- the words " the honorary degree of ..." before the name of the degree, or the words " " af er the name of the degree;
- < that the degree is a degree of the University of London and is awarded on the authority of the governing body of the Federat on Member;
- < the date of conferment;
- < the signatures of the Vice-Chancellor and the Head of the Federat on Member; the signature of the Chair of the Federat on Member governing body may also be included; [The signatures on the diploma remain the same, irrespect ve of who actually confers the degree.] and</p>
- < the University Seal.
- 7.2 Diplomas should be sent to the University Secretary who will arrange for them to be signed by the Vice-Chancellor and for the University Seal to be applied.

8. Record Keeping

- 8.1 Federat on Members will submit to the University of London on an annual basis details of all those persons on which it has conferred or has agreed to confer an honorary degree of the University of London.
- 8.2 The University of London will maintain an appropriate record of awards made.

A 1: Award of Honorary Bachelor of Education

(HonBEd) Criteria

 Eligibility for an HonBEd requires that an individual completed a teaching cert f cate awarded by the University of London for studies undertaken prior to 1984 at any of the following seven inst tut ons: Coloma College of Educat on, Maria Assumpta Teacher Training College, Sit ngbourne College of Educat on, Nonington College of Physical Educat on, Stockwell College of Educat on, Thomas Huxley College and Philippa Fawcet and Furzedown College of Educat on.

Conferment

- 2. The Collegiate Council delegates the conferment of the Honorary Bachelor of Education (HonBEd) award to the Honorary Teaching Degree Conferment Commit ee (HTDCC).
- 3. The HTDCC will be a t me limited commit ee concerned only with the award of the Honorary Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd) in accordance with this regulat on. Its terms of reference and const tut on are determined by the execut ve, and it will report to the Academic Board and Collegiate Council.
- 4. The HTDCC may approve the conferral of an Honorary Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd) of the University of London on an individual who meets the criteria.
- 5. The Honorary Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd) will not normally be conferred on a person who: has already been awarded an honorary degree either by the University or by a Federat on Member; or who has previously declined to accept a University of London award from the University or from a Federat on Member.
- 6. The University Secretary will maintain an appropriate record of honorary degrees awarded. The Development Of ce will retain these records in Senator (the database of Alumni) and a report can be provided at any t me to the University Secretary.
- 7. The Honorary Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd) may in circumstances to be defined by the HTDCC be conferred
- 8. Where the HTDCC has formally resolved to confer an Honorary Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd) and the death of that person occurs before the conferment takes place, the award will be deemed to have been conferred, the date of the conferment being deemed to be the day preceding the date of death.
- 9. All Honorary Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd) degrees will normally be conferred by either the Chancellor or in the absence of the Chancellor, by the Vice-Chancellor or a nominated delegate.
- 10. The revocat on of an Honorary Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd) will be decided by the HTDCC which may be reconvened for that purpose.
- 11. Recipients of Honorary Bachelor of Educat on (HonBEd) should adopt the same rules of academic dress as graduates of the Bachelor of Educat on (BEd) as defined in Regulat on 1, Annex 1.
